Campus Construction Supports Academic Mission

Advance Academic Excellence

Art and Design Building

- Construction Start – 11/07
- Construction Completed – 5/09
- 85,000 square feet
- New facility for College of Visual and Performing Arts

Engineering Building

- Construction Start – 7/07
- Construction Completed – 6/09
- 180,000 square feet
- New facility for Volgenau School of IT&E includes academic, lease and lab areas

Founders Hall

- Construction Start – 7/06
- Construction Complete – 9/10
- 256,000 sq. ft. of offices, classrooms, a library, an auditorium and computer labs
- Built atop an underground parking garage

Krasnow Institute Additions

- Construction Start – 5/06
- Construction Complete – 8/10
- 12,500 square feet
- Increased lab space and research capabilities

Enhance Administrative Capacity

University Hall (Administration Building)

- Construction Start – 12/08
- Construction Complete – 4/11
- General administrative or institutional support functions
- Houses Human Resources and Payroll, Fiscal Services, Sponsored Programs, Tech Transfer, Equity, Legal Services, University Relations and Regional Campus Operations

Student Union Building I (addition)

- Construction Start – 9/09

- Construction Complete – 8/11
- Centralizes all enrollment services
- Houses the offices for Academic and Career Services

Aquia Building (Data Center)

- Construction Start – 4/09
- Construction Complete – 4/10
- Centralizes Information Technology Unit offices
- 25,000 sq. ft. of general university swing space

Improve Quality of Campus Life

Chesapeake Housing Development

- Construction Complete – Summer 2010
- Includes retail outlets, fitness center, restaurant, and resident dining facility
- Raises on-campus student resident population to approximately 5,400

Additional Recreation Facilities (RAC - Newest of four fitness facilities)

- 120,000 square foot recreation facility
- Two-story fitness gallery
- Three gymnasiums, two racquetball courts and two squash courts
- Houses offices for Intramural Sports, Club Sports and the ROTC
- Conference rooms and classrooms

New Entrance Eases Traffic

- Mason Pond Drive connects Patriot Circle to Route 123
- Reduces traffic along Braddock Road
- Easy access to Hotel/Conference Center, Center for Performing Arts, Patriot Center

More Parking (Rappahannock River Parking Deck)

- Construction Start – 10/07
- Construction Completed – 9/09
- Capacity: 2,650 cars
